

The cost-of-living crisis, resulting from high inflation, interest rates, and energy prices has made this a difficult year for many, and I was delighted to see the generosity of villagers to our recent food bank collection.

Personally, I always enjoy this time of year and the build-up to Christmas. Once again, this year's annual carol concert, which the Parish Council are pleased to support, will be held at the Pavilion on Saturday 9th December at 5pm. Music will be provided by Huntingdonshire Concert Band who were excellent last year, and mulled wine, hot chocolate, and mince pies will be available. The village Christmas tree on Vicarage Fields will also be a colourful beacon of joy from the beginning of the month and we hope that you will take time to go and see it.

At the November Parish Council meeting, we discussed and agreed our budget and precept for the next financial year. As always, the Council has had to make decisions about its priorities, and the areas in which we wish to concentrate our efforts. While some areas of our spending are necessary but go unseen, we continue to target our efforts and spending on improving the built and natural environment of the village.

We still have three vacancies on the Council and would be delighted to hear from anyone who would like to join us. If you think you might be interested, why not come to our next meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> January to see what it's all about.

# Parish Council Updates

## Grants available for local organisations - apply now

The Parish Council has a limited amount of money available to award grants to local groups, charities or organisations for "purposes, which may bring a direct benefit to the area or any part of it for some or all the inhabitants". To be considered for an award, please complete the application from available from the Parish Clerk.

Grants awards are made at the Council's March and October meetings. Any payments made are subject to the normal budgetary constraints and only one grant is available to an organisation in any financial year.

#### Food Bank Collection - Thank You



A big thank you to all those residents who donated, collected, organised, or helped in any way with October's Community Foodbank appeal. We'd also like to thank the Parish Church kindly allowed us to use the Parish Centre and also collected for the Food Bank as part of their

Harvest Festival. As you can see even in these most difficult of times your generosity is utterly amazing.

We collected a total of 656kg of food which is enough to provide 25-28 small family 3-day parcels.

Community support for foodbanks is vital in providing help for local people, so thank you once again.

#### Allotments

If you are interested in taking on an allotment, then please contact the Clerk. We don't currently have a waiting list, so while you may not get a plot immediately, it's unlikely that you will have to wait long. You will also be able to join the newly formed allotment association.

## Budgets for 2024 set and agreed

At the full meeting in November, the Council set and agreed its budget and its proposed precept for 2024. Unlike last year, when our decisions had to made against a backdrop of uncertainty due to the spike in inflation and electricity prices, this year our deliberations were made slightly easier by a more stable economic outlook. While we've still had to make some hard decisions about the Council's priorities, we continue to make these based on the desire to improve our built and natural environment. The Council have therefore decided to support the continuation of our Big Green Projects and Community Chest initiatives which underpin the Council's Green Spaces strategy. We have also allocated funds to progress our desire to update and improve the play areas at Daintree Green and on the Yes Development, and to support those local organisations that provide a benefit to the area and our residents.

As always, we're keen to hear of any ideas that you may have about new projects that you or we can take forward.

## **Environment Working Group (EWG) report**

At the November EWG meeting, Councillors and residents met with HDC Councillor Lara Davenport-Ray. It was an interesting meeting with plenty of discussion on a variety of topics. As a result of the meeting the Parish Council has decided to register its interest in future grant programmes to install electric charging points in the Parish. The Council has not previously expressed an interest in this programme as it doesn't own any land where implementation of such a scheme would be possible. However, it is believed that in the future there may be grants available for joint projects. By registering our interest now, the Council will be informed about any new grants.

Cllr Davenport also outlined the new 'Biodiversity for All' grant programme and the EWG has therefore agreed to workup an initial proposal for Council to consider at its meeting in January. This is a two-stage application process whereby the first stage is to outline a scheme for consideration. If this proposal is accepted, then there is a second stage where a detailed grant application is made.

## Alternative Land Management (ALM) proposal

The District Council is proposing to amend its mowing scheme on five verges in the parish. The verges will be mowed once a year, but the edges will be mown regularly. As part of the scheme a floral meadow is proposed for a verge in Margetts. Further details of the verges and the mowing regime are available on the Parish Council website.



The new scheme will come into operation from March 2024 for an initial one year trial period. If you have any concerns about the verges proposed, please contact the Parish Clerk by the 15<sup>th</sup> December who will pass your concerns onto the District Council.

It is hoped that the biodiversity of the verges will increase with wildflowers emerging and the floral meadow should be attractive as well as providing pollen and nectar for butterflies, moths, bees and other insects. The parish council and volunteers may sow wildflower seed and plant wildflower plug plants to give nature a helping hand.

The wildflower beds planted by the Parish Council flourished in Daintree Green and Vicarage Fields this year and provided weeks of colour and food for insects. The bed in Mitchell Close suffered from an invasive weed and so will be monitored more closely next year. The bollard strips of longer grass in Daintree Green and Vicarage Fields were sown with donated Yellow Rattle seed (which reduces the vigour of grasses allowing wildflowers to thrive) and squares of wildflower plants were planted with some of the plants flowering this summer.

## **Planning committee matters**

The Parish Council has no direct planning powers but is consulted by, and can make representations to, Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC). It is HDC's responsibility to inform neighbours of planning applications. Residents are urged to make their own comments on the HDC website. Councillors will usually call on the applicant and relevant neighbours to explain how the council considers applications and how residents can make their views known to the parish council and to HDC. The next Planning Committee meeting will be at 7pm on Monday January 8th in the Reading Room, High Street.

#### Hemingford Action Group update by Iain Muspratt, Chair

On 19th September the Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) started its formal investigation into the proposed acquisition of Mick George Limited by a subsidiary of Heidelberg Cement AG – thus it remains on hold. The CMA has confirmed it will make its initial decision on 27th November. If CMA decides there is a realistic prospect of a substantial lessening of competition it will launch a further investigation.





#### Bus committee on a roll

We will shortly be sending out a brief feasibility study questionnaire to measure the need for a regular dedicated bus within the village. The hope is to have a service up and running by this time next year! We invite more residents to help us launch this project.

#### New Trustees — new roles
